They explore different themes, techniques, and artists, working in sketchbooks and through practical pieces.</p>	<p>Portfolio Development 'Animals' (18 Lessons) Students begin working on larger-scale outcomes. They will be recording ideas and observations in the form of annotations and photographs. This includes a preparatory summer task involving detailed observational studies of facial features. Students are encouraged to collect a wide range of visual research, including photography and observational drawing, to inform and strengthen their practical work.</p>
